NOTICE OF INTENT TO HARVEST, TRANSPORT, AND REPLANT ON PUBLIC OYSTER GROUNDS IN POCOMOKE SOUND FOR THE 2016 OYSTER REPLENISHMENT PROGRAM

Notice is hereby given that the Virginia Marine Resources Commission (VMRC) intends to harvest, transport, and replant shells on Byrd Rock and Marshall Rock in the Pocomoke Sound. VMRC is inviting any person interested in performing this work to apply as indicated below.

Shell and live oysters will be harvested, transported, and replanted in nearby areas.

THIS PROJECT WAS APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION ON FEBRUARY 23, 2016 AND THE COMMISSION RESERVES THE RIGHT TO MAKE CHANGES IN THE PROGRAM AT ANY TIME.

POCOMOKE SOUND:

Shells and live oysters will be harvested by dredge from State-owned bottomland at Byrd Rock and Marshall Rock in the Pocomoke Sound and transported and replanted on adjacent public oyster grounds. Work will be performed in the following area:

Byrd Rock	Approximately 10,000 bushels
Marshall Rock	Approximately 10,000 bushels

METHOD: The work will be done with oyster dredges.

EQUIPMENT SPECIFICATION:

The boat must be large enough to harvest, transport, and plant at least 1,000 bushels per planting.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The work is to be done during the time period March 14, 2016 through May 13, 2016. All dredging and planting is to be completed by 2:00 p.m. daily.

The areas from which shell and live oysters will be harvested and the areas to be planted on will be designated and marked by VMRC personnel.

All work will be supervised by VMRC personnel. All loads will be measured and documented by VMRC personnel.

The Contractor will be paid \$2.00 per bushel for shell cultch and oysters that are harvested, transported, and replanted on adjacent public oyster grounds. Approximately 20,000 bushels are planned to be harvested and transplanted.

Before any payments can be made to the contractor, there must be verification of registration with the Virginia

Department of Minority Business Enterprises, as a small, woman, or minority owned company, and a contract and current Tax form (W-9) completed and on file at the Marine Resources Commission main office. Payment will be made fifteen days after the Conservation and Replenishment Department has received the invoice and all supporting documentation; the check will be forwarded to the contractor by mail.

SELECTION:

VMRC plans to select up to 3 contractors to perform the work. If more responses than this are received then selection will be made by lottery.

LOTTERY:

If more than three applicants should respond, a lottery will be held on March 10, 2016 at 1:00 p.m. in room 303, 3rd floor of the Marine Resources Commission in downtown Newport News at 2600 Washington Avenue. Those wishing to be present are invited to attend.

RESPONSE DEADLINE:

Responses are requested by no later than 12 noon, March 10, 2016.

These responses should be submitted to the James A. Wesson, Dept. Head, VMRC-Conservation and Replenishment Department.
