


The attached tables and figures are the results from the SurveyMonkey survey that was made available to the public from October 19 to October 30, 2020. The purpose of the survey was to solicit public input about the proposed management measures for the 2021-2023 recreational cobia seasons. There were 591 respondents to the survey.

Question 1: In which sector do you fish for cobia?





Question 2: Which of these options do you prefer to achieve the required minimum reduction in harvest of 42%?




